Size of runner 66" x 66" - unfinished block size $121 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 121 / 2^{\prime \prime}-61 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 121 / 2^{\prime \prime}$


Fabrics from the Brensham collection

1. A748.1-Brensham trees on cream $-1 / 2 y d-1 / 2 m$
2. A749.2-Small floral on light blue $-1 / 2 y d-1 / 2 m$
3. A750.3-Tiny berry on dark blue $-1 / 2 y d-1 / 2 m$
4. A751.2-Floral leaves on grey blue $-1 / 2 y d-1 / 2 m$
5. A752.3-Floral trellis on dark blue $-1 / 2 y d-1 / 2 m$
6. BB019-English mustard $-1 \frac{1}{2}$ yds $-11 / 2 m$
7. BB01-White - 2yds $-2 m$

Wadding and backing 70" x 70"
All measurements include $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam allowances; press each seam as you go. You need to join your fabric to get the length for the border strips.

## Cutting

From each of the fabrics 1 and 4 you need to cut
$4 \times 61 / 2 " \times 61 / 2^{\prime \prime}$
$2 \times 31 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 61 / 2^{\prime \prime}$
$20 \times 37 / 8^{\prime \prime} \times 37 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ cut in half diagonally once
From each of the fabrics 2, 3 and 5 you need to cut
$5 \times 61 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 61 / 2^{\prime \prime}$
$20 \times 37 / 8^{\prime \prime} \times 37 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ cut in half diagonally once

## From fabric 6 cut

$2 \times 21 / 2 \times 62^{1 / 2} 2^{1}$ sides
$2 \times 2 \frac{112}{2} \times 661 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ top \& bottom
$2 \times 41 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times 41 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ cut in half diagonally twice
$96 \times 25 / 8^{\prime \prime} \times 25 / 8^{\prime \prime}$

## From fabric 7 cut

$2 \times 1 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 601⁄2" sides
$2 \times 1 \frac{1}{2}$ " $\times 621 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ top \& bottom
$96 \times 41 / 4 " \times 41 / 4 "$ cut in half diagonally twice
$100 \times 31 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 31 / 22^{\prime \prime}$

## Blocks



Block 1


Block 2

All the blocks 1 and 2 are made in the same way.
Block 1 - Lay out the fabric pieces for the block as in the main diagram.
Start with the fly geese block,


Sew the two small triangles to each side of the square. Next stitch the other two triangles to your work. Sew the other three in the small way. Lay out and sew in rows and then stitch you rows together to complete the block. 5 in total for each colour way, but two of the will be 4 and the are half blocks. Which is block 2.

Block 2 - Lay out the fabric pieces for block 2. Sew the two small triangles together on the short edge

and then stitch to the lager triangle to make a square. Make up the flying geese block as before. Lay out and sew in rows and then stitch the rows together to complete the block. Two colours way and 4 in total.


Lay out the blocks as in the main diagram. You will work down each row this time.

Next join the rows together to complete the quilt center.

## Inner border

Sew the sides to the quilt press.
Next stitch the top and bottom strips to the quilt and press.

## Outer border

Stitch the same as the inner border to complete the quilt top.


Sandwich the quilt top, wadding and backing together.
Quilt by hand or machine as desired. Trim the backing and wadding to size of quilt.

## Binding

Use your favorite method from fabric 6 to bind the quilt.

1. A748.2-Brensham trees on French blue $-1 / 2 y d-1 / 2 m$
2. A749.1-Small floral on deep cream $-1 / 2 y d-1 / 2 m$
3. A750.2-Tiny berry on French blue $-1 / 2 y d-1 / 2 m$
4. A751.3-Floral leaves on dark blue $-1 / 2 y d-1 / 2 m$
5. A752.1- Floral trellis on deep cream - $1 / 2 \mathrm{yd}-1 / 2 m$
6. BB08-Zennor blue $-1 \frac{1}{2}$ yds $-11 / 2 m$
7. BB02-Cream - 2yds $-2 m$

Wadding and backing 70" x 70"
All measurements include $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam allowances; press each seam as you go. You need to join your fabric to get the length for the border strips.

## Cutting

From each of the fabrics 1 and 4 you need to cut
$4 \times 61 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 61 / 2^{\prime \prime}$
$2 \times 31 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 61 / 2^{\prime \prime}$
$20 \times 37 / 8^{\prime \prime} \times 37 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ cut in half diagonally once

## From each of the fabrics 2,3 and 5 you need to cut

$5 \times 61 / 2 " \times 61 / 2^{\prime \prime}$
$20 \times 37 / 8^{\prime \prime} \times 37 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ cut in half diagonally once

## From fabric 6 cut

$2 \times 21 / 2 \times 621 / 2^{1}$ sides
$2 \times 21 / 2{ }^{\prime \prime} \times 661 / 2$ " top \& bottom
$2 \times 41 / 4$ " $\times 41 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ cut in half diagonally twice
$96 \times 25 / 8^{\prime \prime} \times 25 / 8^{\prime \prime}$

## From fabric 7 cut

$2 \times 1 \frac{1}{2}$ " $\times 601 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ sides
$2 \times 1 \frac{1}{2} /{ }^{\prime \prime} \times 621 / 2$ " top \& bottom
$96 \times 4 \frac{1}{4}$ " $\times 4 \frac{1}{4}$ " cut in half diagonally twice
$100 \times 31 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 311 / 2^{\prime \prime}$



Block 1


Block 2

All the blocks 1 and 2 are made in the same way.
Block 1 - Lay out the fabric pieces for the block as in the main diagram.
Start with the fly geese block,


Sew the two small triangles to each side of the square. Next stitch the other two triangles to your work. Sew the other three in the small way. Lay out and sew in rows and then stitch you rows together to complete the block. 5 in total for each colour way, but two of the will be 4 and the are half blocks. Which is block 2.

Block 2 - Lay out the fabric pieces for block 2. Sew the two small triangles together on the short edge

and then stitch to the lager triangle to make a square. Make up the flying geese block as before. Lay out and sew in rows and then stitch the rows together to complete the block. Two colours way and 4 in total.
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Lay out the blocks as in the main diagram. You will work down each row this time.

Next join the rows together to complete the quilt center.

## Inner border

Sew the sides to the quilt press.
Next stitch the top and bottom strips to the quilt and press.

## Outer border

Stitch the same as the inner border to complete the quilt top.

Sandwich the quilt top, wadding and backing together.
Quilt by hand or machine as desired. Trim the backing and wadding to size of quilt.

## Requirements

Fabrics from the Brensham collection

1. A748.3-Brensham trees on dark blue $-1 / 2 y d-1 / 2 m$
2. A749.3-Small floral on mid blue $-1 / 2 y d-1 / 2 m$
3. A750.1-Tiny berry on deep cream $-1 / 2 y d-1 / 2 m$
4. A751.1-Floral leaves on deep cream $-1 / 2 y d-1 / 2 m$
5. A752.2 - Floral trellis on French grey $-1 / 2 y d-1 / 2 m$
6. BB06-Light pink $-1 \frac{1}{2} \mathrm{yds}-1 \frac{1}{2} \mathrm{~m}$
7. BB01-White - 2yds $-2 m$

Wadding and backing 70" x 70"
All measurements include $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam allowances; press each seam as you go.
You need to join your fabric to get the length for the border strips.

## Cutting

From each of the fabrics 1 and 4 you need to cut
$4 \times 61 / 22^{\prime \prime} \times 1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$
$2 \times 31 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 61 / 2^{\prime \prime}$
$20 \times 37 / 8^{\prime \prime} \times 37 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ cut in half diagonally once

## From each of the fabrics 2,3 and 5 you need to cut

$5 \times 61 / 2 " \times 61 / 2 "$
$20 \times 37 / 8^{\prime \prime} \times 37 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ cut in half diagonally once

## From fabric 6 cut

$2 \times 21 / 2 \times 621 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ sides
$2 \times 2 \frac{1}{2}$ " $\times 661 / 2{ }^{\prime \prime}$ top \& bottom
$2 \times 41 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times 41 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ cut in half diagonally twice
$96 \times 25 / 8^{\prime \prime} \times 25 / 8^{\prime \prime}$

## From fabric 7 cut

$2 \times 1 \frac{1}{2}$ " $\times 601 / 2$ " sides
$2 \times 1 \frac{112 "}{}$ " $\times 62^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime}$ top \& bottom
$96 \times 41 / 4 " \times 41 / 4$ " cut in half diagonally twice
$100 \times 31 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 31 / 2^{\prime \prime}$
