

Fabrics from the Small Things Countryside collection

- 1. SM64.1 Farm animals on warm cream ³/₈yd 40cm
- 2. SM65.2 Horses on stable blue ³/₈yd 40cm
- 3. SM66.3 Chickens and ducks on country blue ³/₈yd 40cm
- 4. SM67.1 Farm vehicles and wellies on light pebble 3/3 yd 40cm
- 5. SM68.3 Country animals on manor blue 3/8 yd 40 cm
- 6. BB29 Indigo 1¾yd 1.30m
- 7. BB20 Brazilian orange 5⁄8yd 60cm

Wadding and backing 55" x 66"

All measurements include ¼" seam allowances; press each seam as you go. you will need to join your strips to get the length on the borders.



From each of the fabrics 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5 you need to cut

4 x 2" x 10½" 8 x 2" x 9" 4 x 2" x 7½ 4 x 2" x 6½ 8 x 2" x 5" 4 x 2" x 3½ 4 x 3½ x 3½

From fabric 6 cut

2 x 3¹/₂" x 56¹/₂" sides (outer border) 2 x 3¹/₂" x 51¹/₂" top & bottom (outer border) 12 x 1¹/₂" x 1¹/₂" sashing squares 20 x 1¹/₂" x 6¹/₂" 20 x 1¹/₂" x 7¹/₂"

From fabric 7 cut

2 x 1¹/₂ x 54¹/₂" sides (inner border) 2 x 1¹/₂" x 45¹/₂" top & bottom (inner border) 31 x 1¹/₂" x 10¹/₂" sashing



Block 1

Block 5.

The first four blocks are from the top row of the quilt and number 5 block is on the second row of blocks. Rows 1, 3 and 5 are sewn in the same way.

On rows 2 and 4 you will flip the block as in block 5. Look at the main diagram for which way you place the fabrics colours on each row.



This is the first block

All of the block are make-up in the same way. It's just that 8 blocks will be flip.

Lay out the fabric pieces for the block. Have put number on the block so you can see where to star sewing strips to the square. You will work sew number 2 strip to the square. Keep adding until you get to strip 5.

Next take strip 6 and sew to the square and then work your out with the numbers until last strip. In total you need 20 blocks, but look at each block on the diagram as to placement of fabric strips for each block.



Lay out the blocks, squares and sashing strips as in the main diagram.



This is row 1 and 2 of blocks with the sashing in between.

First row stitch blocks to sashing pressing the seams the same way. On the next row sashing strips and squares. This time press you seams the opposite way. Do this to each row as it will help when sewing the rows together.

When all the rows are complete you can join them together to fished the quilt center



Inner border

Sew the strips of fabric 7 to the sides of the quilt, press back and then the stitch the top and bottom strips to the quilt.

Outer border


You will stitch the outer border same as the inner border to complete the quilt top.



Sandwich the quilt top, wadding and backing together.

Quilt by hand or machine as desired. Trim the backing and wadding to size of quilt.

Use your favorite method from fabric 6 to bind the quilt.

Requirements

Fabrics from the Small Things Countryside collection

- 1. SM64.2 Farm animals on jute 3/8yd 40cm
- 2. SM65.1 Horses on pale country pink 3/8yd 40cm
- 3. SM66.1 Chickens and ducks on warm grey 3/8yd 40cm
- 4. SM67.2 Farm vehicles and wellies on dark grey 3/3 yd 40cm
- 5. SM68.2 Country animals on natural ³/₈yd 40cm
- 6. BB10 Wiltshire green 13/3yd 1.30m
- 7. BB29 Indigo 5⁄8yd 60cm

Wadding and backing 55" x 66"

All measurements include ¼" seam allowances; press each seam as you go. you will need to join your strips to get the length on the borders.



- From each of the fabrics 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5 you need to cut
- 4 x 2" x 10½" 8 x 2" x 9" 4 x 2" x 7½" 4 x 2" x 6½" 8 x 2" x 5" 4 x 2" x 3½" 4 x 3½" x 3½"

From fabric 6 cut

2 x 3¹/₂" x 56¹/₂" sides (outer border) 2 x 3¹/₂" x 51¹/₂" top & bottom (outer border) 12 x 1¹/₂" x 1¹/₂" sashing squares 20 x 1¹/₂" x 6¹/₂" 20 x 1¹/₂" x 7¹/₂"

From fabric 7 cut

 $2 \times 1\frac{1}{2} \times 54\frac{1}{2}$ " sides (inner border) $2 \times 1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $45\frac{1}{2}$ " top & bottom (inner border) $31 \times 1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $10\frac{1}{2}$ " sashing



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


Block 2

Blocks












The first four blocks are from the top row of the quilt and number 5 block is on the second row of blocks. Rows 1, 3 and 5 are sewn in the same way.





Fabrics from the Small Things Countryside collection

- 1. SM64.3 Farm animals on country green 3/8yd 40cm
- 2. SM65.3 Horses on latte 3/yd 40cm
- 3. SM66.2 Chickens and ducks on soft khaki ³/₈yd 40cm
- 4. SM67.3 Farm vehicles and wellies on navy blue 3/8 yd 40cm
- 5. SM68.1 Country animals on light grey 3/8yd 40cm
- 6. BB26 Dark red 1 3/8 yd 1.30m
- 7. BB19 English mustard 5/3 yd 60cm

Wadding and backing 55" x 66"

All measurements include ¼" seam allowances; press each seam as you go. you will need to join your strips to get the length on the borders.



From each of the fabrics 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5 you need to cut

4 x 2" x 10½" 8 x 2" x 9" 4 x 2" x 7½ 4 x 2" x 6½ 8 x 2" x 5" 4 x 2" x 3½ 4 x 3½ x 3½


From fabric 6 cut

2 x 3½" x 56½" sides (outer border) 2 x 3½" x 51½" top & bottom (outer border) 12 x 1½" x 1½" sashing squares 20 x 1½" x 6½" 20 x 1½" x 7½"

From fabric 7 cut

2 x 1½ x 54½" sides (inner border) 2 x 1½" x 45½" top & bottom (inner border) 31 x 1½" x 10½" sashing





On rows 2 and 4 you will flip the block as in block 5. Look at the main diagram for which way you place the fabrics colours on each row.



Block 4

This is the first block

All of the block are make-up in the same way. It's just that 8 blocks will be flip.

Lay out the fabric pieces for the block. Have put number on the block so you can see where to star sewing strips to the square. You will work sew number 2 strip to the square. Keep adding until you get to strip 5.
