Size of runner 38" x 38" - unfinished block size $18\frac{1}{2}$ " x $18\frac{1}{2}$ " - $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ "

Requirements

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Fabrics from the Small Things Celtic collection:

1. SM71.1 - Highland cow on natural Celtic check - 1yd - 1m

- 2. SM72.2 Thistle on mist check fat 1/4
- 3. SM73.3 Scottie dog on loch blue fat1/4
- 4. SM74.3 Red check fat 1/4
- 5. SM75.2 Stag on green fat 1/4
- 6. D1 Cream dreams 5/4yd 60cm

Wadding and backing 11/4yd - 1.10cm

All measurements include 1/4" seam allowances; press each seam as you go.

Cutting

From fabric 1 cut

2 x 3½" x 38½" outer border (top & bottom)

 $2 \times 3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $32\frac{1}{2}$ "outer border (sides)

 $1 \times 6\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " for center block

From fabric 2 cut

2 x 61/8" x 61/8" cut in half diagonally once

2 x 71/4" x 71/4" cut in half diagonally twice

From fabric 3 cut

2 x 71/4" x 71/4" cut in half diagonally twice

4 x 3½" x 3½"

From fabric 4 cut

2 x 61/8" x 61/8" cut in half diagonally once

2 x 71/4" x 71/4" cut in half diagonally twice

From fabric 5 cut

 $3 \times 7\frac{1}{4}$ " x $7\frac{1}{4}$ " cut in half diagonally twice

From fabric 6 cut

1 x 71/4" x 71/4" cut in half diagonally twice

36 x 31/8" x 31/8" cut in half diagonally once

Making up blocks





Center block

Flying Geese block

Lay out the fabric pieces for block 1. Make up the corner first.





Corner block

Middle block

Stitch the small triangles to each side of the square, press and then sew the two triangles together to make a square. Sew all four corners.

Middle blocks.

Sew the two small triangles together and the stitch to the lager triangle to make the square. Do the same to the other three.

Lay out as in center block. Sew in rows and then stitch the rows together to complete the block.

Flying Geese blocks.

You need one large pattern fabric triangle and two small background fabric triangles. Sew one small triangle to the larger one, press back. Now stitch the other to complete the block. You need 32 in total.

Making up the table topper top.

Lay out all the blocks as in the main diagram. Stitch the corners blocks together in sets of two. Next sew five Flying Geese blocks together. Sew to the sides and on the other two add the corner blocks to each end of the strips. Stitch to the table topper.

Now sew the inner border strips to the sides of fabric 6 and then top & bottom.

Do the same to the outer border to complete the table topper.

Quilting and binding


Sandwich the quilt top, wadding and backing together.

Quilt by hand or machine a pattern to match the table topper fabric.

Maybe flowers. Trim the backing and wadding to size of the table topper.

Binding

Use your favorite method from fabric 1 for binding the quilt.

- SM72.1 Thistle on cream check fat¼
- 3. SM73.2 Scottie dog on warm purple fat1/4
- 4. SM74.2 Green check fat¹/₄
- 5. SM75.3 Stag on purple fat1/4
- 6. D1 Cream dreams 5/4 yd 60cm

Wadding and backing 11/4yd - 1.10cm

All measurements include 1/4" seam allowances; press each seam as you go.

Cutting

From fabric 1 cut

2 x 3½" x 38½" outer border (top & bottom)

 $2 \times 3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $32\frac{1}{2}$ "outer border (sides)

1 x 61/2" x 61/2" for center block

From fabric 2 cut

2 x 61/8" x 61/8" cut in half diagonally once

2 x 71/4" x 71/4" cut in half diagonally twice

From fabric 3 cut

2 x 71/4" x 71/4" cut in half diagonally twice

4 x 3½" x 3½"

From fabric 4 cut

2 x 61/8" x 61/8" cut in half diagonally once

 $2 \times 7\frac{1}{4}$ " x $7\frac{1}{4}$ " cut in half diagonally twice

From fabric 5 cut

3 x 71/4" x 71/4" cut in half diagonally twice

From fabric 6 cut

1 x 71/4" x 71/4" cut in half diagonally twice

36 x 31/8" x 31/8" cut in half diagonally once

Making up blocks

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Center block

Flying Geese block



- 5. SM75.1 Stag on cream fat1/4
- 6. D19 Grey dreams 5/8 yd 60cm

Wadding and backing 11/4yd - 1.10cm

All measurements include 1/4" seam allowances; press each seam as you go.

Cutting

From fabric 1 cut

2 x 3½" x 38½" outer border (top & bottom)

 $2 \times 3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $32\frac{1}{2}$ "outer border (sides)

1 x 61/2" x 61/2" for center block

From fabric 2 cut

2 x 61/8" x 61/8" cut in half diagonally once

2 x 71/4" x 71/4" cut in half diagonally twice

From fabric 3 cut

2 x 71/4" x 71/4" cut in half diagonally twice

4 x 3½" x 3½"

From fabric 4 cut

2 x 61/8" x 61/8" cut in half diagonally once

 $2 \times 7\frac{1}{4}$ " x $7\frac{1}{4}$ " cut in half diagonally twice

From fabric 5 cut

3 x 71/4" x 71/4" cut in half diagonally twice

From fabric 6 cut

1 x 71/4" x 71/4" cut in half diagonally twice

36 x 31/8" x 31/8" cut in half diagonally once

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





