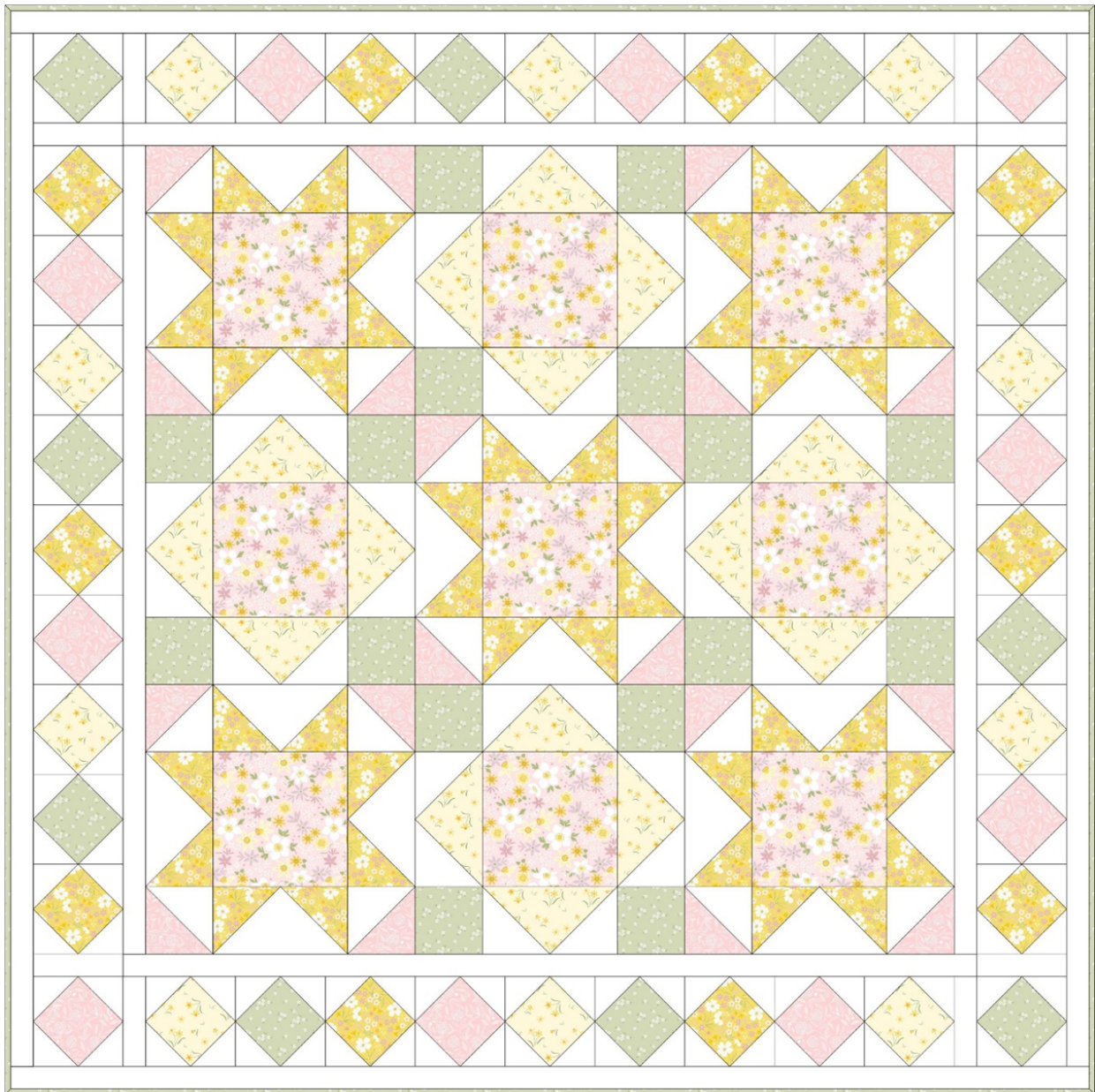

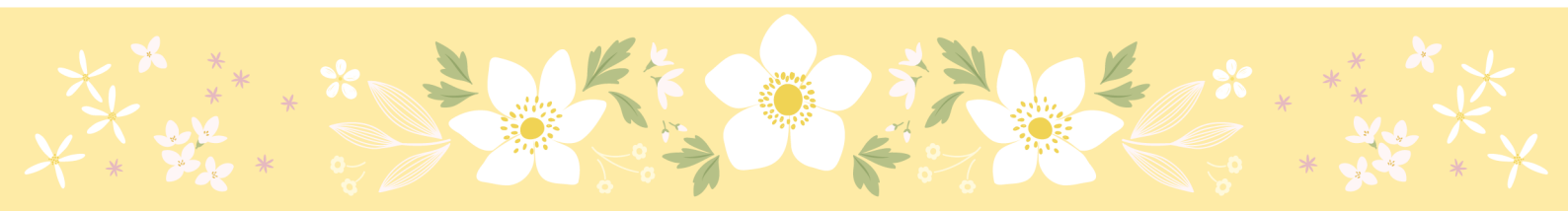
Size of quilt 48" x 48"

Unfinished block sizes- 12½" x 12½" and 4½" x 4½"

Main Diagram



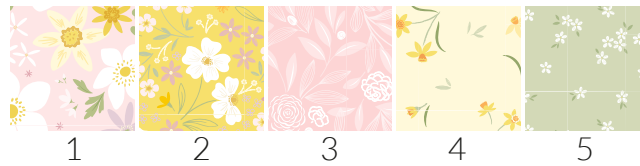


Requirements

Fabrics from Joys of Spring collection by Cassandra Connolly for Lewis and Irene.

1. CC46.1 - Springtide - Pastel Pink - $\frac{3}{8}$ yd - 40cm
2. CC47.2 - Songs of Spring - Sunshine Yellow - $\frac{3}{8}$ yd - 40cm
3. CC48.1 Camellias Charm - Light Pink - fat $\frac{1}{4}$
4. CC49.1 - Daffodil Delight - Pastel Yellow - $\frac{1}{2}$ yd - $\frac{1}{2}$ m
5. CC50.1 - Flowerets - Pale Sage Green - $\frac{1}{2}$ yd - 50cm
6. Background fabric 1 $\frac{5}{8}$ yd - 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ m

Wadding and backing 55" x 55"



All measurements include $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowances; press each seam as you go.

You need to join your fabric to get the length for the outer border strips.

Cutting

From fabric 1 cut
9 x 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " both blocks

From fabric 2 cut
20 x 3 $\frac{7}{8}$ " x 3 $\frac{7}{8}$ " cut in half diagonally once - block 1
10 x 3 $\frac{3}{8}$ " x 3 $\frac{3}{8}$ " - for middle border

From fabric 3 cut
10 x 3 $\frac{7}{8}$ " x 3 $\frac{7}{8}$ " cut in half diagonally once - block 1
10 x 3 $\frac{3}{8}$ " x 3 $\frac{3}{8}$ " - for middle border

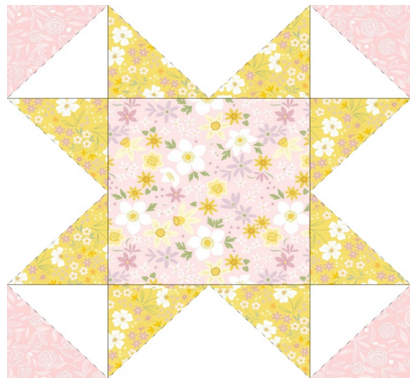
From fabric 4 cut
4 x 7 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 7 $\frac{1}{4}$ " cut in half diagonally twice - block 2
10 x 3 $\frac{3}{8}$ " x 3 $\frac{3}{8}$ " - for middle border

From fabric 5 cut
16 x 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " - block 2
10 x 3 $\frac{3}{8}$ " x 3 $\frac{3}{8}$ " - for middle border

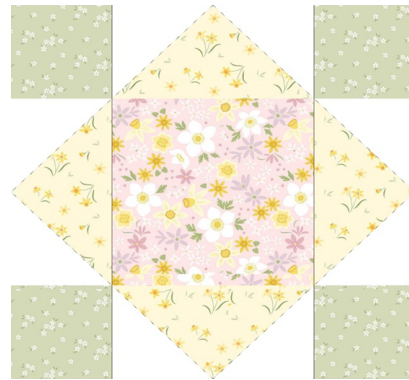
From fabric 6 cut
2 x 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 48 $\frac{1}{2}$ " - outer border top & bottom
2 x 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 46 $\frac{1}{2}$ " - outer border sides
2 x 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 38 $\frac{1}{2}$ " - inner border top & bottom
2 x 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 36 $\frac{1}{2}$ " - inner border sides
5 x 7 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 7 $\frac{1}{4}$ " cut in half diagonally twice - block 1
26 x 3 $\frac{7}{8}$ " x 3 $\frac{7}{8}$ " cut in half diagonally once - for both blocks
70 x 2 $\frac{7}{8}$ " x 2 $\frac{7}{8}$ " cut in half diagonally once - for middle border
8 x 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " - for middle border



Making up the blocks

Block 1-

Lay out the fabric pieces for each block. Start by sewing the small corner triangles together to make a square. Then sew the Flying Geese block.



Stitch a small triangle of number 2 to the larger triangle of number 1 on the short side and then add the other small triangle of number 3 to this.

Lay out all the pieces and sew in rows, then sew your rows together to complete the block. For block 1 you need 5 in total.

Block 2-



As before for these flying geese blocks stitch the two small triangles to the larger triangle. Lay out as in block diagram 2. Sew in rows and then stitch the rows together to complete the blocks. For block 2 you need 4 in total.



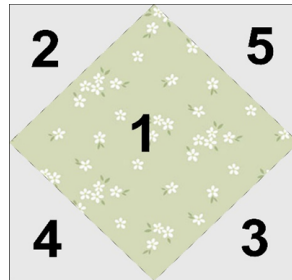
Making up the centre of the throw

Lay out the 9 blocks as in the main diagram. Stitch together in rows and then sew the rows together to complete the throw center.

Inner border

Sew the side strips to the throw, press and then the top and the bottom.

Middle border



Take a $3\frac{3}{8}$ " x $3\frac{3}{8}$ " square and the $2\frac{7}{8}$ " triangles. Fold the square in half and do the same to the triangle along the long edge. Match the two folds and pin into place. So, 2 and 3 press and then 4 and 5 to make a square. Sew ten of each colours 2 to 5.

Stitch 9 blocks together as in the main diagram. On the side strips add a $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " to the top and bottom. Sew to the throw. This time you will add a strip and square to each end to the top and bottom.

Outer border

Sew the side strips, press back and then the top and bottom to complete the throw top.

Quilting

Sandwich quilt top, wadding and backing together. Quilt by hand or machine as desired.

Trim backing and wadding to size of quilt.

Binding

Use your favourite binding method using fabric 5 to bind the quilt.

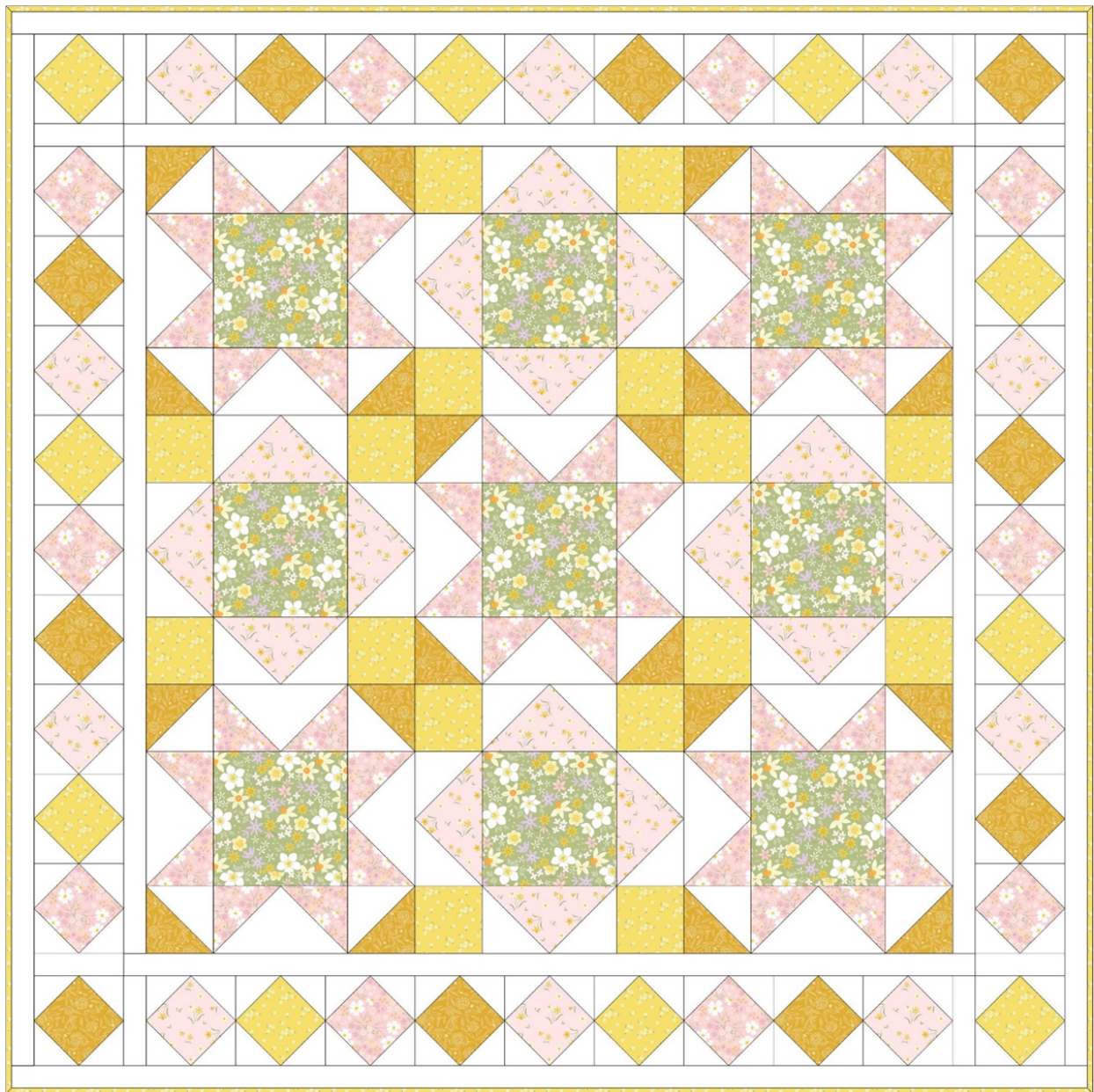
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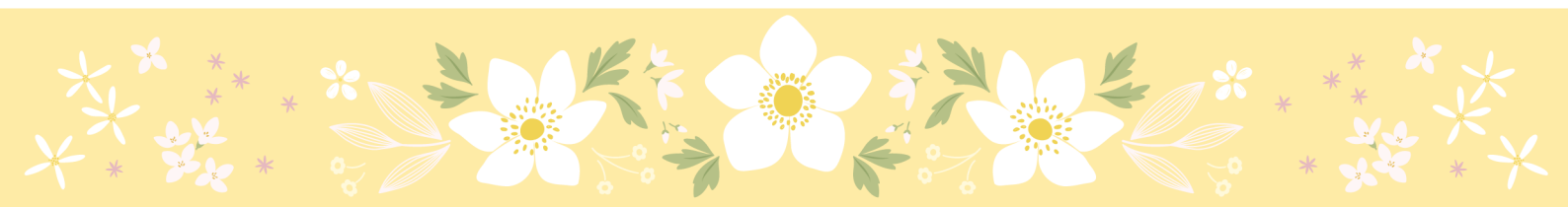

2. CC47.3 - Songs of Spring - Light Pink - $\frac{3}{8}$ yd - 40cm
3. CC48.2 - Camellias Charm - Sunrise Orange - fat $\frac{1}{4}$
4. CC49.2 - Daffodil Delight - Pastel Pink - $\frac{1}{2}$ yd - 50cm
5. CC50.2 - Flowerets - Sunshine Yellow - $\frac{1}{2}$ yd - 50cm
6. Background fabric 1 $\frac{5}{8}$ yd - 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ m

Wadding and backing 55" x 55"



All measurements include $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowances; press each seam as you go.

You need to join your fabric to get the length for the outer border strips.

Cutting

From fabric 1 cut
9 x 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " both blocks

From fabric 2 cut
20 x 3 $\frac{7}{8}$ " x 3 $\frac{7}{8}$ " cut in half diagonally once - block 1
10 x 3 $\frac{3}{8}$ " x 3 $\frac{3}{8}$ " - for middle border

From fabric 3 cut
10 x 3 $\frac{7}{8}$ " x 3 $\frac{7}{8}$ " cut in half diagonally once - block 1
10 x 3 $\frac{3}{8}$ " x 3 $\frac{3}{8}$ " - for middle border

From fabric 4 cut
4 x 7 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 7 $\frac{1}{4}$ " cut in half diagonally twice - block 2
10 x 3 $\frac{3}{8}$ " x 3 $\frac{3}{8}$ " - for middle border

From fabric 5 cut
16 x 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " - block 2
10 x 3 $\frac{3}{8}$ " x 3 $\frac{3}{8}$ " - for middle border

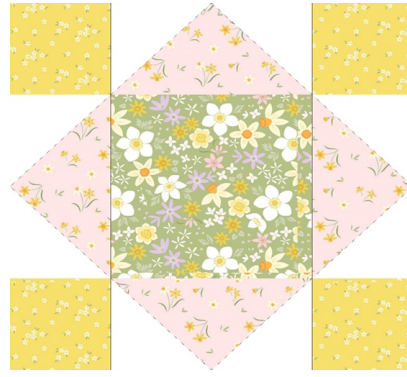
From fabric 6 cut
2 x 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 48 $\frac{1}{2}$ " - outer border top & bottom
2 x 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 46 $\frac{1}{2}$ " - outer border sides
2 x 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 38 $\frac{1}{2}$ " - inner border top & bottom
2 x 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 36 $\frac{1}{2}$ " - inner border sides
5 x 7 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 7 $\frac{1}{4}$ " cut in half diagonally twice - block 1
26 x 3 $\frac{7}{8}$ " x 3 $\frac{7}{8}$ " cut in half diagonally once - for both blocks
70 x 2 $\frac{7}{8}$ " x 2 $\frac{7}{8}$ " cut in half diagonally once - for middle border
8 x 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " - for middle border



Making up the blocks

Block 1-

Lay out the fabric pieces for each block. Start by sewing the small corner triangles together to make a square. Then sew the Flying Geese block.



Stitch a small triangle of number 2 to the larger triangle of number 1 on the short side and then add the other small triangle of number 3 to this.

Lay out all the pieces and sew in rows, then sew your rows together to complete the block. For block 1 you need 5 in total.

Block 2-



As before for these flying geese blocks stitch the two small triangles to the larger triangle. Lay out as in block diagram 2. Sew in rows and then stitch the rows together to complete the blocks. For block 2 you need 4 in total.



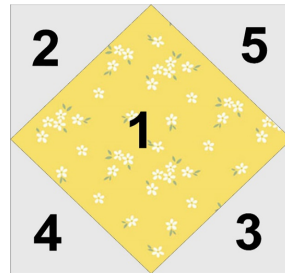
Making up the centre of the throw

Lay out the 9 blocks as in the main diagram. Stitch together in rows and then sew the rows together to complete the throw center.

Inner border

Sew the side strips to the throw, press and then the top and the bottom.

Middle border



Take a $3\frac{3}{8}$ " x $3\frac{3}{8}$ " square and the $2\frac{7}{8}$ " triangles. Fold the square in half and do the same to the triangle along the long edge. Match the two folds and pin into place. So, 2 and 3 press and then 4 and 5 to make a square. Sew ten of each colours 2 to 5.

Stitch 9 blocks together as in the main diagram. On the side strips add a $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " to the top and bottom. Sew to the throw. This time you will add a strip and square to each end to the top and bottom.

Outer border

Sew the side strips, press back and then the top and bottom to complete the throw top.

Quilting

Sandwich quilt top, wadding and backing together. Quilt by hand or machine as desired.

Trim backing and wadding to size of quilt.

Binding

Use your favourite binding method using fabric 5 to bind the quilt.

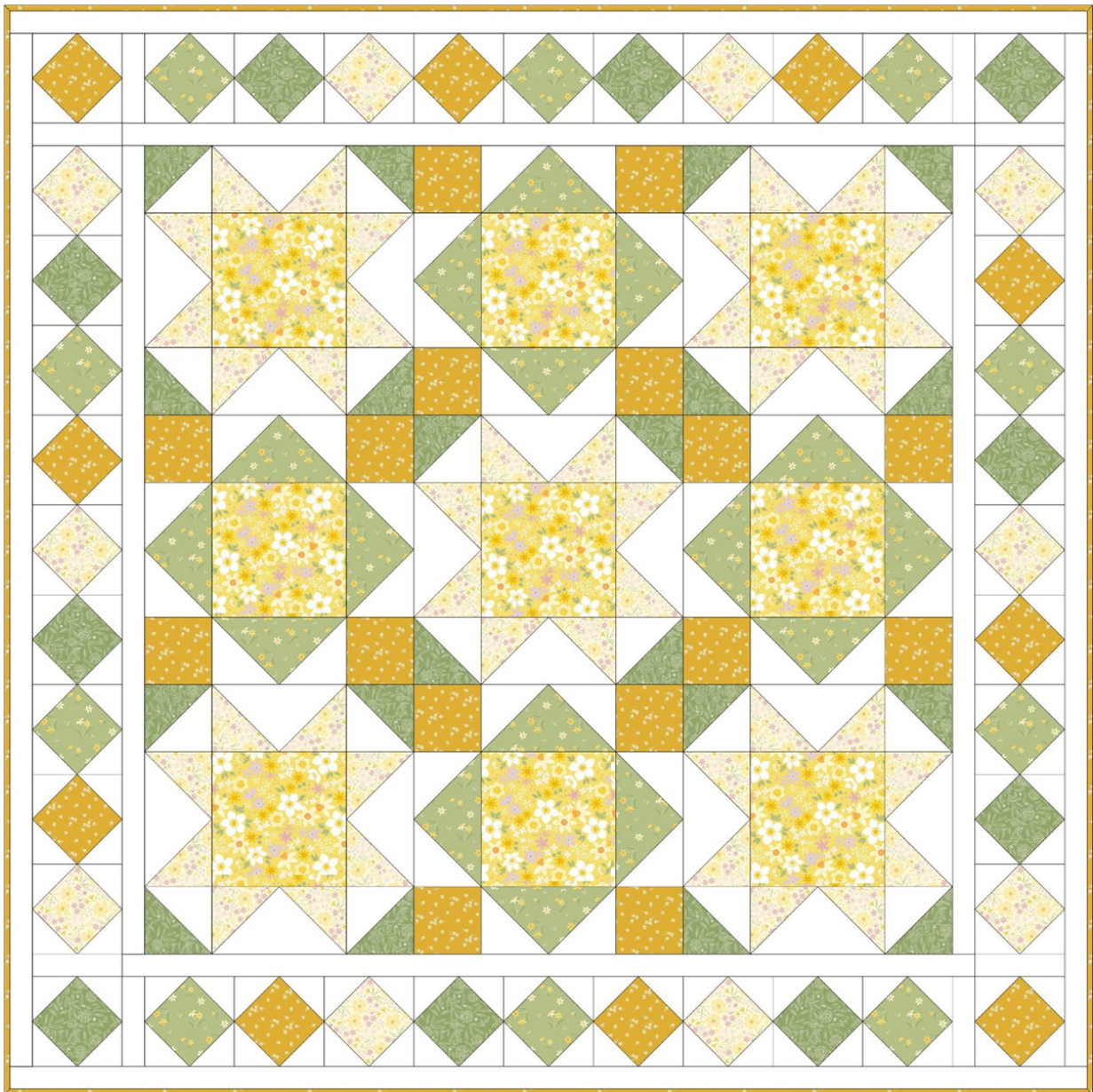
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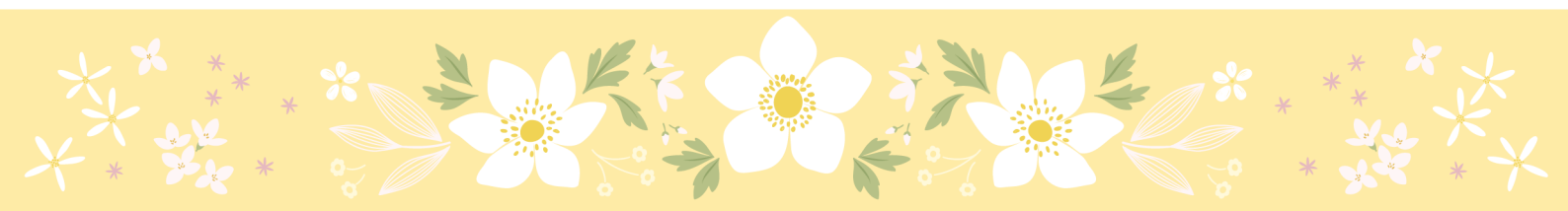

3. CC48.3 - Camellias Charm - Dark Spring Green - fat $\frac{1}{4}$
4. CC49.3 - Daffodil Delight - Spring Green - $\frac{1}{2}$ yd - 50cm
5. CC50.3 - Flowerets - Sunrise Orange - $\frac{1}{2}$ yd - 50cm
6. Background fabric 1 $\frac{5}{8}$ yd - 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ m

Wadding and backing 55" x 55"



All measurements include $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowances; press each seam as you go.

You need to join your fabric to get the length for the outer border strips.

Cutting

From fabric 1 cut
9 x 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " both blocks

From fabric 2 cut
20 x 3 $\frac{7}{8}$ " x 3 $\frac{7}{8}$ " cut in half diagonally once - block 1
10 x 3 $\frac{3}{8}$ " x 3 $\frac{3}{8}$ " - for middle border

From fabric 3 cut
10 x 3 $\frac{7}{8}$ " x 3 $\frac{7}{8}$ " cut in half diagonally once - block 1
10 x 3 $\frac{3}{8}$ " x 3 $\frac{3}{8}$ " - for middle border

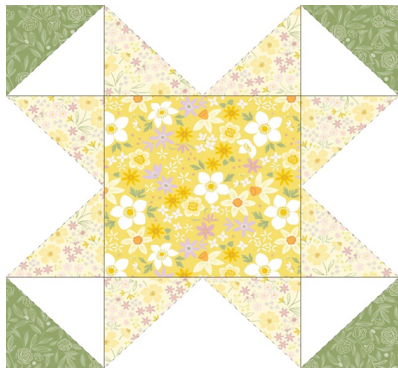
From fabric 4 cut
4 x 7 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 7 $\frac{1}{4}$ " cut in half diagonally twice - block 2
10 x 3 $\frac{3}{8}$ " x 3 $\frac{3}{8}$ " - for middle border

From fabric 5 cut
16 x 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " - block 2
10 x 3 $\frac{3}{8}$ " x 3 $\frac{3}{8}$ " - for middle border

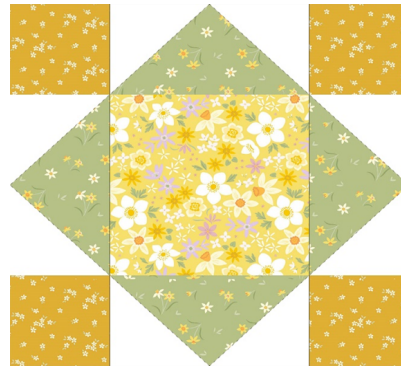
From fabric 6 cut
2 x 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 48 $\frac{1}{2}$ " - outer border top & bottom
2 x 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 46 $\frac{1}{2}$ " - outer border sides
2 x 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 38 $\frac{1}{2}$ " - inner border top & bottom
2 x 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 36 $\frac{1}{2}$ " - inner border sides
5 x 7 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 7 $\frac{1}{4}$ " cut in half diagonally twice - block 1
26 x 3 $\frac{7}{8}$ " x 3 $\frac{7}{8}$ " cut in half diagonally once - for both blocks
70 x 2 $\frac{7}{8}$ " x 2 $\frac{7}{8}$ " cut in half diagonally once - for middle border
8 x 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " - for middle border

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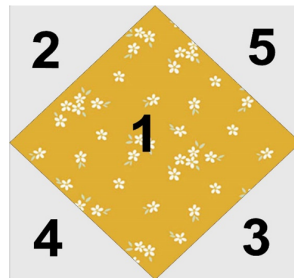
Making up the centre of the throw

Middle border



Take a $3\frac{3}{8}$ " x $3\frac{3}{8}$ " square and the $2\frac{7}{8}$ " triangles. Fold the square in half and do the same to the triangle along the long edge. Match the two folds and pin into place. So, 2 and 3 press and then 4 and 5 to make a square. Sew ten of each colours 2 to 5.

Stitch 9 blocks together as in the main diagram. On the side strips add a $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " to the top and bottom. Sew to the throw. This time you will add a strip and square to each end to the top and bottom.

Outer border

Sew the side strips, press back and then the top and bottom to complete the throw top.

Quilting

Sandwich quilt top, wadding and backing together. Quilt by hand or machine as desired.

Trim backing and wadding to size of quilt.

Binding

Use your favourite binding method using fabric 5 to bind the quilt.

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
