Fabrics from Old Quercus collection

Requirements

1. A934A - Acorn trellis on green mist - $\frac{3}{4}$ yd - $\frac{3}{4}$ m
2. A932A - Wise owls on light gold - $\frac{1}{2}$ yd - $\frac{1}{2}$ m
3. BBS7 - Red & Rust - 1yd - 1m
4. A935C - Fox and owl on cosy gold - $\frac{3}{8}$ yd - 40cm
5. A933B - Sketched oak leaves on woodland green - $\frac{1}{2}$ yd - $\frac{1}{2}$ m
6. A936C - Fox and squirrel on stone - fat $\frac{1}{4}$
7. BBS6 - Leafy green - $\frac{3}{4}$ yd - $\frac{3}{4}$ m
8. A937 - Acorns on darkest oak - $\frac{3}{8}$ yd - 40cm

Wadding and backing 60" x 60"

All measurements include $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowances; press each seam as you go.

Cutting

From fabric 1 cut

20 x 3" x 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " block 1

20 x 3" x 3" block 1

From fabric 2 cut

5 x 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " block 1

20 x 3" x 3" block 1

From fabric 3 cut

5 x 6 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 6 $\frac{1}{4}$ " cut in half diagonally twice block 1

24 x 2" x 15 $\frac{1}{2}$ " sashing strips

From fabric 4 cut

10 x 6 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 6 $\frac{1}{4}$ " cut in half diagonally twice block 1

From fabric 5 cut

16 x 3" x 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " block 2

16 x 3" x 3" block 2

From fabric 6 cut

4 x 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " block 2

16 x 3" x 3" block 2

From fabric 7 cut

5 x 6¼" x 6¼" cut in half diagonally twice block 2

16 x 2" x 2" sashing squares

From fabric 8 cut

8 x 6¼" x 6¼" cut in half diagonally twice block 2

Making up the blocks

Both blocks are made up in the same way. Lay out the fabric pieces for block 1 as in the diagram.

Start with the corner squares. Stitch the two small squares together and then stitch the strip 3" x 5½" to this to make a square as in diagram 1. Make up the other three as before but make sure your squares are like the block diagram.

Next work on diagram 2 by sewing two small triangles together, press. Do the same to the other side and then sew the two triangles together to make a square. Make up the other three as before but make sure your squares are like the block diagram.

Now lay out as in the block diagram. Stitch in rows and then sew the rows together to complete the block. You need 5 in total of block 1.

Block 2 is made up in the same way as **block 1** just different fabrics and you only need 4 blocks in total.

Making up the throw top

Lay out the sashing strips, squares and blocks as in the main diagram.

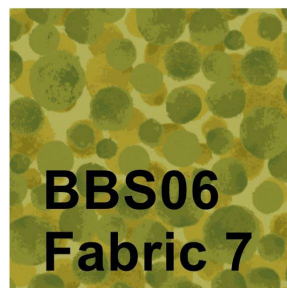
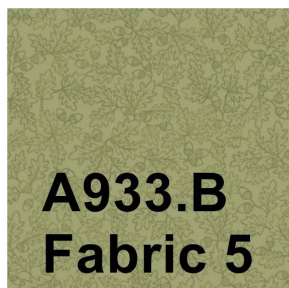
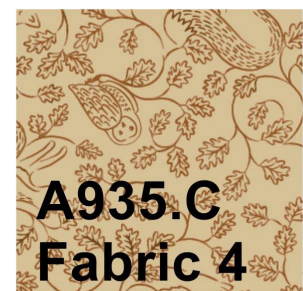

Quilting and binding

Sandwich the throw top, wadding and backing together.

Quilt by hand or machine as desired. Trim the backing and wadding to size of throw.

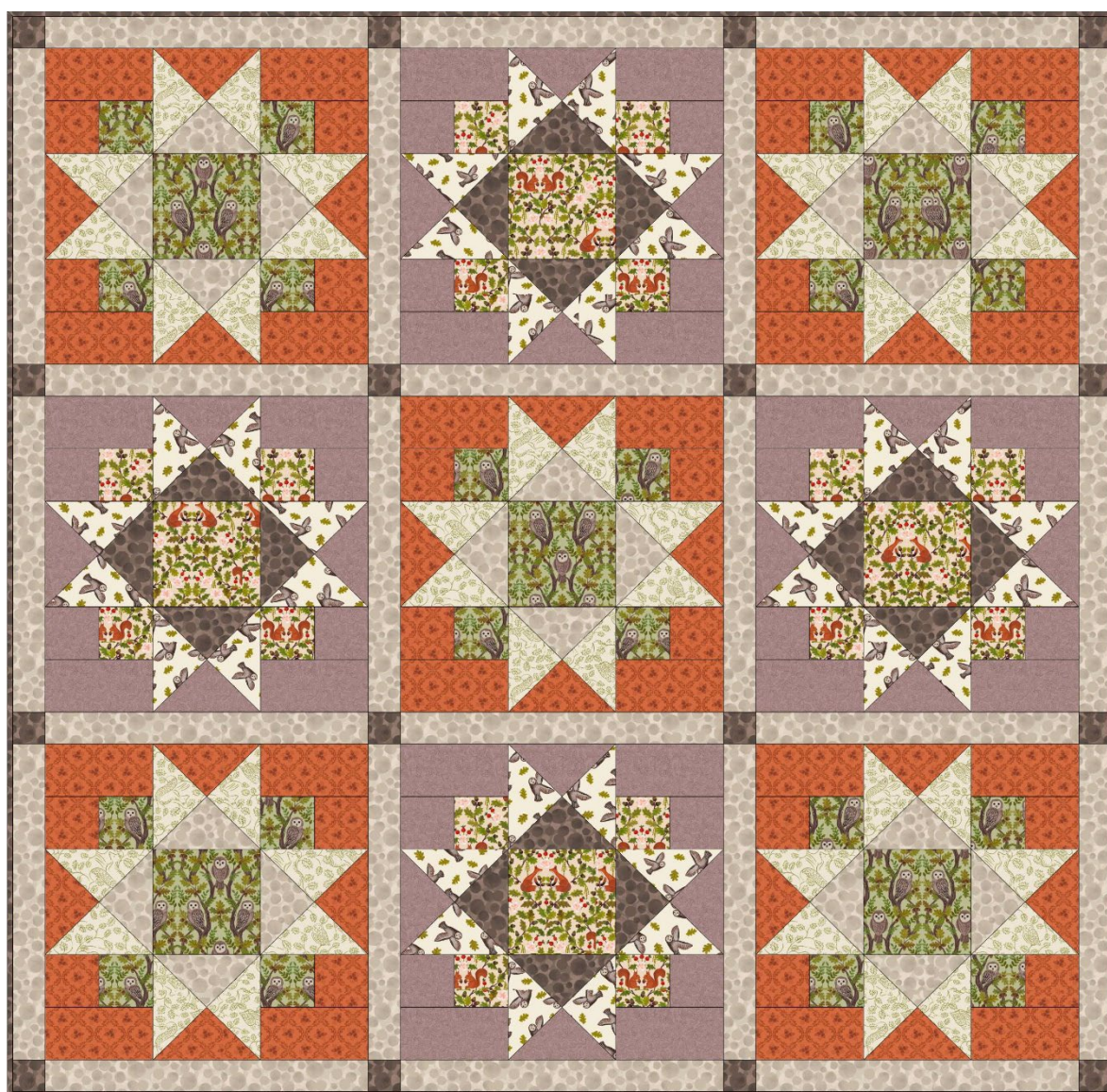
Use your favorite method from fabric 7 to bind the quilt.

1. A934C - Acorn trellis on autumnal orange - $\frac{3}{4}$ yd - $\frac{3}{4}$ m
2. A932B - Wise owls on green - $\frac{1}{2}$ yd - $\frac{1}{2}$ m
3. BB04 - Latte - 1yd - 1m
4. A935A - Fox and owl on linen - $\frac{3}{8}$ yd - 40cm
5. A933C - Sketched oak leaves on light brown - $\frac{1}{2}$ yd - $\frac{1}{2}$ m
6. A936A - Fox and squirrel on dark cream - fat $\frac{1}{4}$
7. BB024 - Chocolate - $\frac{3}{4}$ yd - $\frac{3}{4}$ m
8. A938 - Flying owl on dark cream - $\frac{3}{8}$ yd - 40cm

Wadding and backing 60" x 60"

All measurements include $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowances; press each seam as you go.

Cutting

From fabric 1 cut

20 x 3" x 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " block 1

20 x 3" x 3" block 1

From fabric 2 cut

5 x 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " block 1

20 x 3" x 3" block 1

From fabric 3 cut

5 x 6 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 6 $\frac{1}{4}$ " cut in half diagonally twice block 1

24 x 2" x 15 $\frac{1}{2}$ " sashing strips

From fabric 4 cut

10 x 6 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 6 $\frac{1}{4}$ " cut in half diagonally twice block 1

From fabric 5 cut

16 x 3" x 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " block 2

16 x 3" x 3" block 2

From fabric 6 cut

4 x 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " block 2

16 x 3" x 3" block 2

From fabric 7 cut

5 x 6¼" x 6¼" cut in half diagonally twice block 2

16 x 2" x 2" sashing squares

From fabric 8 cut

8 x 6¼" x 6¼" cut in half diagonally twice block 2

Making up the blocks

1. A934B - Acorn trellis on apple green - $\frac{3}{4}$ yd - $\frac{3}{4}$ m
2. A932C - Wise owls on dark oak - $\frac{1}{2}$ yd - $\frac{1}{2}$ m
3. BB022 - New Forest green - 1yd - 1m
4. A935B - Fox and owl on autumn mist - $\frac{3}{8}$ yd - 40cm
5. A933A - Sketched oak leaves on light stone - $\frac{1}{2}$ yd - $\frac{1}{2}$ m
6. A936B - Fox and squirrel on warm terracotta - fat $\frac{1}{4}$
7. BBS7 - Red & Rust - $\frac{3}{4}$ yd - $\frac{3}{4}$ m
8. A939 - Fox on light terracotta - $\frac{3}{8}$ yd - 40cm

Wadding and backing 60" x 60"

All measurements include $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowances; press each seam as you go.

Cutting

From fabric 1 cut

20 x 3" x 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " block 1

20 x 3" x 3" block 1

From fabric 2 cut

5 x 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " block 1

20 x 3" x 3" block 1

From fabric 3 cut

5 x 6 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 6 $\frac{1}{4}$ " cut in half diagonally twice block 1

24 x 2" x 15 $\frac{1}{2}$ " sashing strips

From fabric 4 cut

10 x 6 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 6 $\frac{1}{4}$ " cut in half diagonally twice block 1

From fabric 5 cut

16 x 3" x 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " block 2

16 x 3" x 3" block 2

From fabric 6 cut

4 x 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " block 2

16 x 3" x 3" block 2

From fabric 7 cut

5 x 6¼" x 6¼" cut in half diagonally twice block 2

16 x 2" x 2" sashing squares

From fabric 8 cut

8 x 6¼" x 6¼" cut in half diagonally twice block 2

Making up the blocks
