Main Diagram

Fabrics from A Celtic Christmas collection

Requirements

1. C130A - Highlands on misty silver - fat $\frac{1}{4}$
2. C131B - Celtic trees on festive sage - fat $\frac{1}{4}$
3. C132C - Christmas check - 1yd - 1m (border and binding)
4. C133C - Festive Celtic leaves winter - fat $\frac{1}{4}$
5. C134A - Thistledown on silver - fat $\frac{1}{4}$
6. C135B - Highlands and holly ice meadow gingham - fat $\frac{1}{4}$
7. C136 - Celtic Christmas 1 yard squares panel
8. BB02 - Cream - $\frac{5}{8}$ yd - $\frac{5}{8}$ m
9. BB10 - Wiltshire green - $\frac{1}{2}$ yd - $\frac{1}{2}$ m

Wadding and backing 60" x 60"

All measurements include $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowances; press each seam as you go.

You need to join your fabric to get the length for the border strips.

Cutting

From fabric 1 cut

2 x 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 21" strips

Subcut: 4 x 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ "

From each of the fabrics 2,4,5 and 6 you need to cut

2 x 6" x 21" strips

Subcut: 4 x 6" x 6" cut in half diagonally once

From fabric 3 cut

5 x 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips

Make: 2 x 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 54 $\frac{1}{2}$ " (top & bottom outer border)

2 x 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 50 $\frac{1}{2}$ " (sides outer border)

6 x 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips – sew together to make binding

From fabric 7 cut

4 x 17 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 17 $\frac{1}{2}$ "

From fabric 8 cut

3 x 6" x WOF strips

Subcut: 16 x 6" x 6" cut in half diagonally once

From fabric 9 cut

8 x 2" x WOF strips

Subcut: 8 x 2" x 20½"

8 x 2" x 17½"

Making up the blocks



This is made up in four parts. Take the cushion panels and stitch the sides strips to the panel, press. Next do the same to the top and bottom strips.



Lay out all the fabric pieces for the throw as in the main diagram. Sew two small triangles together to make a square.

Do this to all the small triangles. Looking at the main diagram as to where to place the small blocks around the panels. Join four pieced blocks together and sew to cushion panel side. On the other one add a square and stitch to complete the block.

Join in rows and then stitch the two rows together to complete the center of throw.

Border

Stitch the sides to the throw and then the top and bottom to complete the throw.

Quilting and binding

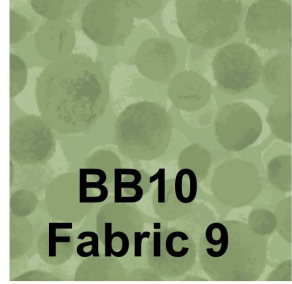
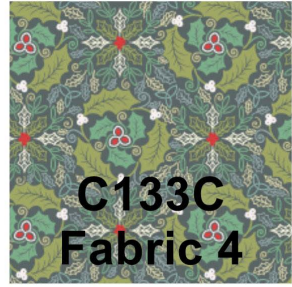
Sandwich the quilt top, wadding and backing together.

Quilt by hand or machine a pattern to match the quilt.

Trim the backing and wadding to size of quilt.

Binding

Use your favorite method from fabric 3 for binding the quilt
